EXPECTED TO SLOWDOWN TO 4.1% THIS FROM 5.5% IN 2021	<ul> <li>might become entrenched if education systems are disrupted and countries' ability to sustain their low-income populations are hindered by high national debt. Higher interest rates and the removal of fiscal support could have a negative impact on low-income countries, which are already vulnerable.</li> <li>The World Bank is pushing support for policies that will strengthen impoverished nations' financial institutions and develop local infrastructure in ways that will drive growth, as well as enhance debt reduction initiatives. It will be critical to reduce global supply chain bottlenecks, notably for Covid vaccination doses.</li> </ul>
